Maya Helps Monarchs

- ① For the school science night, Maya is creating a short presentation about monarch butterflies. Her central idea is that people can help monarchs by planting native flowers. She plans to explain that monarch caterpillars need milkweed for food, while adult butterflies drink nectar from many flowers. Maya wants each part of her presentation to point back to the action people can take.
- ② After she explains milkweed, Maya will show a close-up photograph of a monarch caterpillar eating a milkweed leaf. A short caption will read, "Milkweed feeds monarch caterpillars." The photograph helps the audience connect the plant to the caterpillar's need. Maya will not add a picture of a playground, even though it is colorful, because it does not explain how to help monarchs.
- ③ At the end, Maya will display two labeled photos, one of milkweed and one of a nectar flower. Beside them, she will write, "Plant both kinds of flowers." This final visual repeats her central idea and gives the audience a clear action. She will speak the names of local native plants, so listeners can look for them later.

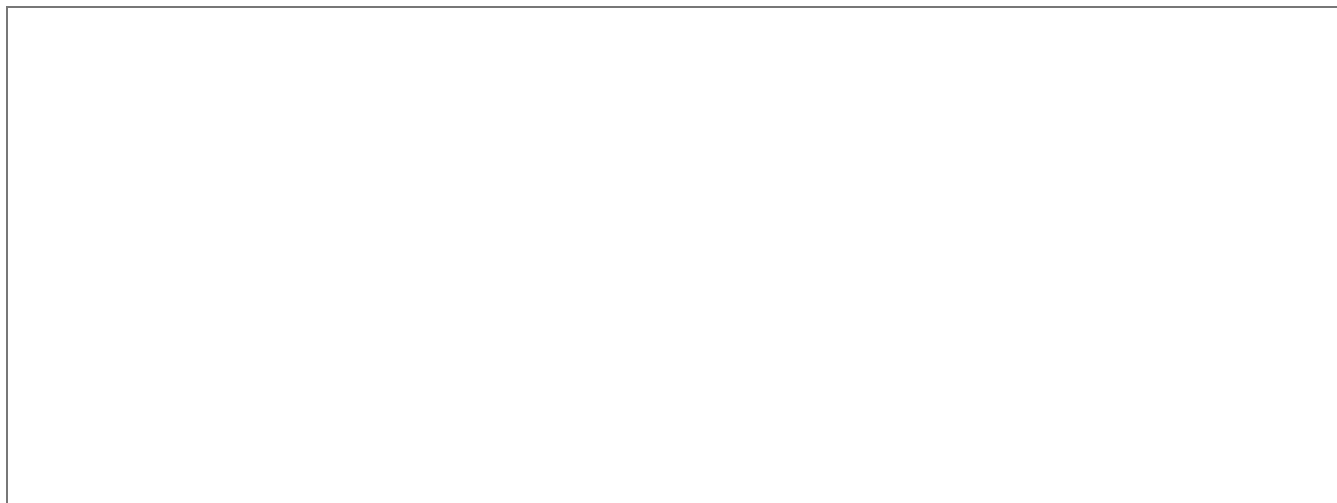
