Maya Plans a Cleanup

- ① At lunch, Maya spoke to her friend Sam about Saturday's creek cleanup. “Hey, Sam, are you coming to the cleanup? Bring your gloves, okay? We can meet by the playground at nine.” Sam nodded and said he would bring a water bottle, too. Maya used a relaxed voice because she was talking with a friend during lunch.
- ② Later, Maya gave a short announcement to the whole school. “Good morning, students. Our school will hold a creek cleanup this Saturday from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. Please bring work gloves and a reusable water bottle. Meet near the playground, where adults will give directions.” Her words gave the larger audience clear information about the event.
- ③ Before the event, Maya spoke to a group of second graders. “Please stay with your adult. Put litter in the bags, and do not touch sharp objects. If you have a question, raise your hand.” She spoke slowly and used short directions. Her words helped the younger students understand how to work safely together outside.
