Maya's Garden Proposal

- ① At the town youth council, Maya will argue that the vacant lot beside the library should become a pollinator garden. Her main claim is that a garden would give bees and butterflies food while creating a calm outdoor learning space. She opens with a simple title slide that states this claim in large type. She does not fill the slide with facts. The audience can quickly see the point she wants them to consider before she explains her evidence.
- ② Next, Maya displays a bar graph from a survey of 60 students. Forty-two students said they would use an outdoor space for reading, science observations, or quiet time. The graph makes one finding easy to notice: most surveyed students could use the garden. Maya says the graph does not prove that every student wants the project. It supports her claim that the space would serve many students. She names the survey source beneath the graph so listeners can judge the evidence.
- ③ To emphasize the garden's benefit for pollinators, Maya adds a labeled digital photo of a bee on a flowering plant. An arrow points to the flower, and a short caption says, "Bees collect nectar and pollen from flowers." This image helps listeners connect the word pollinator to a real example. Maya leaves out decorative animations and unrelated pictures because they could distract from her claim. She ends by repeating the main claim and asking the council to approve a small planning team.
