HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each prompt and each printed choice aloud. A feeling word tells how someone feels, and a sense word tells something a person can taste, hear, or feel.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • FEELINGS

SAY “Listen to each short story. I will read the three words in the row. Which word tells how the person feels?”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Jia opened a gift she had wished for. The words are book, skip, happy. Which word tells how Jia feels?	happy
b	Noah heard thunder and hid under a blanket. The words are scared, yellow, clap. Which word tells how Noah feels?	scared
c	Someone tore Sam's drawing, and Sam's face felt hot and he wanted to yell. The words are green, mad, sleep. Which word tells how Sam feels?	mad

PART 2 • SENSES

SAY “Look at the words on the left and the words on the right. I will read them all. Can you draw a line from each thing to the word that tells what you can taste, hear, or feel?”

- **lemon** matches **sour**
- **bell** matches **loud**
- **blanket** matches **soft**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Feeling circles, in order, are happy, scared, and mad. Sense matches are lemon to sour, bell to loud, and blanket to soft.
