HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Choose six familiar classroom books with clear front covers, back covers, and title pages. For Part 1, show the front cover, back cover, and title page in order for Rows 1 through 3. For Part 2, label three displayed books 1, 2, and 3, and show Book 1's front cover, Book 2's back cover, and Book 3's title page.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Look at the part of the book I am holding up. I will read the words in each row. Which word names the part you see? Circle that word.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	For Row 1, which word names the part you see? Circle it.	FRONT
b	For Row 2, which word names the part you see? Circle it.	BACK
c	For Row 3, which word names the part you see? Circle it.	TITLE

PART 2 • MATCH BOOKS

SAY “Look at the three books labeled 1, 2, and 3. I will read the words on the right. Draw a line from each book number to the word that names the part you see on that book.”

- **1** matches **FRONT**
- **2** matches **BACK**
- **3** matches **TITLE**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Part 1 answers are Row 1: FRONT, Row 2: BACK, Row 3: TITLE. Part 2 matches are 1 to FRONT, 2 to BACK, and 3 to TITLE; accept a clear line or a circle that clearly shows the intended match.
