HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each prompt aloud and pause so students can say the feeling or idea before they circle. Students practice using clear words to share a feeling or an idea, then trace two language frames they can use when speaking.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE WORDS

SAY “Listen to each short situation. Say the feeling or idea aloud first, then listen as I read the words in the row. Which word matches what you want to say? Circle it.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Your cousin comes to visit, and you feel cheerful. Which feeling word can you say? I will read the words: sad, happy, mad. Say, “I feel ____.” Which word matches your feeling? Circle it.	HAPPY
b	During choice time, you want to read a book with a friend. Which word shares your idea? I will read the words: book, blocks, paint. Say, “I think we should use ____.” Which word matches your idea? Circle it.	BOOK
c	You want red paint for your picture. Which word shares your idea? I will read the words: blue, green, red. Say, “I think red paint is best.” Which word matches your idea? Circle it.	RED

PART 2 • TRACE WORDS

SAY “What is one feeling you have right now? Tell a partner, “I feel,” and finish the thought with your own word. Trace the words in the first box. What is one idea you have for a game or activity? Tell a partner, “I think,” and finish the thought with your own words. Trace the words in the second box.”
