HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each story and the printed choices aloud. A producer makes goods or provides a service, and a consumer uses or benefits from goods or services.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “The letter P means producer. The letter C means consumer. Listen to each story, then circle the word that names the person.”

a	Mia makes muffins to sell. Is Mia a producer, a consumer, or a good? Circle the word.	Producer
b	Leo gets a haircut. Is Leo a producer, a consumer, or a good? Circle the word.	Consumer
