Four River Valley Societies

- ① Four early centers of civilization developed in Mesopotamia beside the Tigris and Euphrates, Egypt along the Nile, the Indus River valley, and China's Yellow River valley. Rivers supplied water for farming. These societies shared cities, government, specialized jobs, religion, language or record keeping, technology, and social hierarchy: unequal levels of power or wealth.
- ② In Mesopotamia, walled cities such as Ur had rulers, officials, soldiers, merchants, farmers, and craftspeople. Kings and priests held high positions, while enslaved people had few rights. Temples were religious centers. Scribes pressed cuneiform signs into clay tablets to record goods, taxes, and laws. Canals carried river water to fields, and the wheel helped move goods. In Egypt, pharaohs governed a kingdom along the Nile. Priests served gods in temples, scribes wrote in hieroglyphs, and farmers, builders, and artisans performed specialized work.
- ③ Farther east, the Indus cities of Harappa and Mohenjo-daro had straight streets, brick buildings, wells, and covered drains. Their planned construction and standard weights suggest organized government and skilled workers. Seals carry a writing system that scholars have not yet read. Archaeologists have found objects that may show religious practices and homes of different sizes, evidence of social differences. In the Yellow River valley, rulers governed early Chinese states. Farmers, bronze workers, and scribes had different jobs. Oracle-bone writing recorded questions for ancestors, and bronze tools and weapons showed advanced technology.
