HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each row aloud and give students time to circle one large word. Students show that safe rules can be made by people in authority, such as a teacher or principal, to help keep people healthy and safe. Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • SAFE RULES

SAY “Listen to each question. I will read the words in each row. Circle one word that answers each question.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Your teacher makes a hall rule to help everyone stay safe. The words are WALK, RUN, and PUSH. Which word names the safe rule?	WALK
b	The school nurse has a health rule about clean hands. The words are SHARE, WASH, and COUGH. Which word tells what to do with your hands?	WASH
c	You are at the curb with an adult. Cars are passing. Listen: GO, RUN, STOP. What should you do before entering the street?	STOP

PART 2 • RULE MAKERS

SAY “Listen to each question and the three people in the row. Circle the person who is in charge of that rule.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Listen: PRINCIPAL, TEACHER, PARENT. Who teaches our class and helps us make classroom rules?	TEACHER
b	Listen: TEACHER, PARENT, PRINCIPAL. Who leads the whole school and helps set school rules?	PRINCIPAL

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Safe Rules answers are WALK, WASH, and STOP. Rule Makers answers are TEACHER for the classroom rule and PRINCIPAL for the whole-school rule.
