HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Use this sheet during a class discussion about making rules for shared spaces and activities. Read every printed choice aloud, then invite students to explain their thinking before they mark the page.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • WHO CAN HELP?

SAY “We are going to think about who may share ideas for rules. I will read the words in each row. Listen to the question, then circle one word.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	At recess, who can share an idea for a new safety rule? The words are Kids, Adults, Both. Which word shows who can share an idea?	Both
b	Before our class uses paint, who can share an idea for a new cleanup rule? The words are Both, Kids, Adults. Which word shows who can share an idea?	Both
c	When a school rule needs changing, who can share an idea? The words are Adults, Both, Kids. Which word shows who can share an idea?	Both

PART 2 • CAST A VOTE

SAY “Now you can share a rule idea. Which rule would you like to suggest for our class? Say your idea aloud, then write the first letter of your name in one box beside a rule you choose.”

- Box 1 (beside Walk): **The student's first name initial in this box, if the student chooses Walk.**
- Box 2 (beside Share): **The student's first name initial in this box, if the student chooses Share.**
- Box 3 (beside Listen): **The student's first name initial in this box, if the student chooses Listen.**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Part 1 answers are Both, Both, Both, in the printed positions 3, 1, and 2. In Part 2, accept one recognizable first-name initial in any one box, since each choice is a valid student rule suggestion.
