The Robin Family

- ① On a warm morning, Mia saw a robin pull a worm from the grass. The bird carried the worm to a nest in a maple tree. Inside the nest, three baby robins opened their wide mouths.
- ② Later, Mia watched the parent robin fly away and return with more food. The babies made soft peeping sounds each time it came back. Mia did not see the babies leave the nest or look for food.
- ③ At home, Mia told her brother that the parent robin was caring for its young. She used what she saw: the parent brought food, and the babies stayed in the nest. Her brother agreed that those details supported her idea.
