A Bean Plant Visit

- ① On Tuesday, Maya’s class visited the school garden. Ms. Chen showed them a bean plant climbing a tall pole. Thin, curly tendrils wrapped around the pole. The plant uses the pole for support, she explained.
- ② Next, the class looked under broad leaves. They found small white flowers and tiny green beans. Ms. Chen said the flowers can grow into bean pods. The children noticed bees visiting the flowers for nectar.
- ③ Back inside, Maya drew the plant in her notebook. She added labels for the pole, tendrils, flowers, and beans. Under her drawing, she wrote that bean plants need support as they climb. Her notes helped her remember the visit.

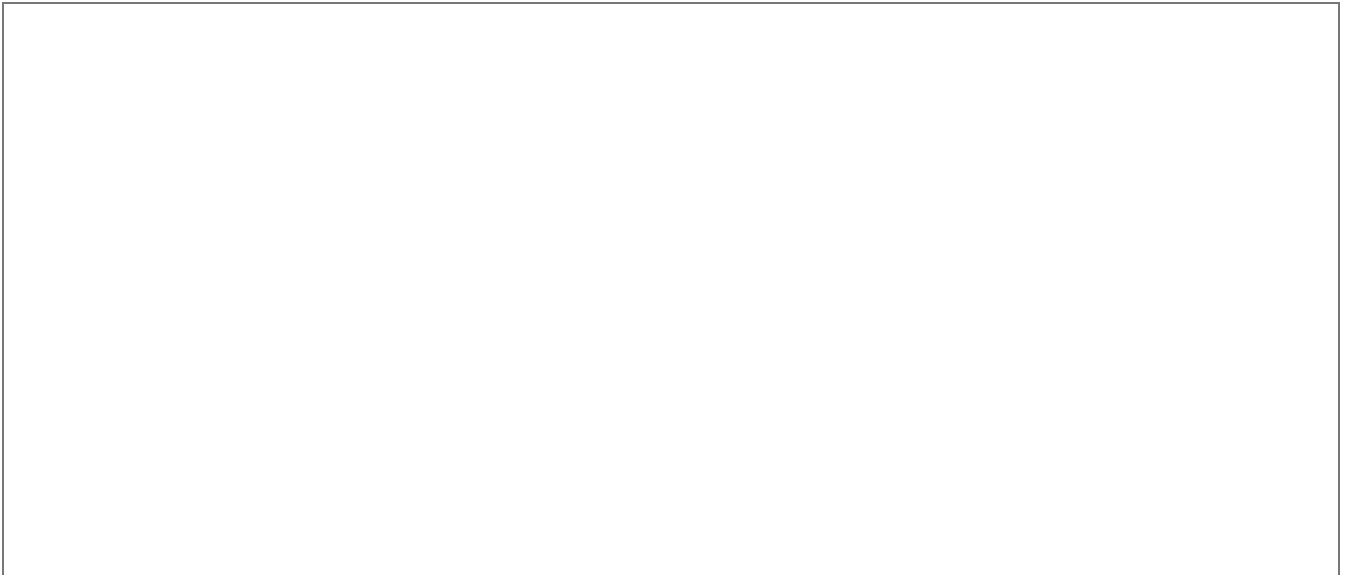
