The soil felt dry, so the students added more water. Later, clouds covered the sun, and a light rain began. The class happily watched the drops splash on the leaves.
- ③ Yesterday, the garden club picked the ripe tomatoes. First, Mia held a basket while her friend Sam gently twisted each tomato from its stem. Next, they neatly placed the tomatoes in the basket. Finally, the club proudly carried the harvest to the cafeteria. The cook quickly used the tomatoes in a fresh salad for lunch.
