Lila's Reading Time

- ① On Tuesday, Lila visited the library during class reading time. She did not grab the first book she saw. She looked at three covers, read the back of each one, and opened the book about a young mapmaker. The first page made her wonder where the mapmaker would travel. Lila chose that book and settled into a blue chair.
- ② At first, the room was quiet. Then a cart rattled past the door, and two students began putting away puzzles nearby. Lila kept her finger on the page and read the same sentence again. She took a slow breath, moved her chair a little farther from the noise, and continued reading. Soon, she was following the mapmaker across a windy bridge.
- ③ When the reading timer rang, Lila had read for twenty minutes. She placed a paper flag at the next chapter and wrote one note: "The bridge may lead to the hidden village." Before leaving, she put the book in her class book box. Lila wanted to return to the story tomorrow, so she knew exactly where to begin.
