The Empty Lot

- ① On Saturday, Maya carried a small tomato plant to the empty lot beside her apartment. The lot was filled with rocks and weeds. Mr. Chen, who lived upstairs, was already there with a shovel. “I thought we could make a garden,” he said. Maya looked at the hard ground and wondered if one plant could make any difference.
- ② By noon, three neighbors had joined them. One pulled weeds, and another brought water in a blue bucket. Maya placed her tomato plant in a soft patch of soil they had made together. She noticed that the lot did not look so lonely anymore. The work was muddy and slow, but each person added something useful.
- ③ A week later, tiny yellow flowers opened on Maya’s plant. More people stopped by the lot. Some asked whether they could grow beans or carrots. Maya gave them the extra seed packets Mr. Chen had shared. She remembered her first doubt. The garden was still small, yet it had changed an empty place into a spot where neighbors worked and talked together.
