### Maya's Bird Count Notes

- ① On Saturday, Maya joined the River Park bird count during the morning walk beside the water. Near the pond, she spotted two herons. The gray heron stood taller than the green heron, but the green heron made quieter steps through the reeds. Maya wrote both details in her notebook. She knew that careful comparisons would help readers picture the birds clearly and accurately.
- ② At the next trail, Maya watched three woodpeckers. In her sketches, the downy woodpecker was the smallest bird. The hairy woodpecker had a longer bill than the downy woodpecker. Maya gave the red-bellied woodpecker the brightest red patch in her drawing because its color stood out against the brown bark. She checked in her notes that each comparison named the birds being compared.
- ③ Before the count ended, Maya chose a title for her report. “Birds by the Pond” was a good title, but “River Park Bird Count” was better. Of all her title ideas, “Morning Wings at River Park” was the best. She also described the calmest place near the pond, where small waves made the water smoother than the water near the rocky shore.
