Mia's Greenhouse Notes

- ① At the city greenhouse, Mia checks the young tomato plants daily before school. She usually looks under the leaves for tiny insects and always adds water when the soil feels dry. Today, the plants are very tall, but a few leaves are slightly curled. Mia writes her observations in a notebook so the garden team can compare changes over time.
- ② The class visits the greenhouse during science time. The students often measure the plants and record their heights on a chart. The compost pile is quite warm because tiny organisms break down old leaves and food scraps. Students rarely touch the compost with bare hands, since it can hold germs. Then, they use tools and wash their hands.
- ③ By late spring, the tomato plants may produce yellow flowers, followed by green tomatoes. Mia sometimes sees bees move pollen between the flowers. A tomato can be nearly ripe when it has changed color, but it should feel firm, not mushy. Mia never picks every tomato at once. She leaves some fruit on the vine until it is fully ready for the class salad.
