Three Ways to Share Water-Saving Results

- ① After the fourth-grade classes tested three ways to save water at school, Maya shared the results in a short written report. Her report included a table showing that turning off the faucet while soaping hands saved the most water. Written words and a table worked well because readers could study the numbers slowly and compare each idea.
- ② For the morning announcements, Luis gave an oral presentation about the same test. He said the main result clearly and explained one number: the faucet rule saved the most water. He did not list every number from the table. Listeners had little time, so a brief spoken message helped them understand the important result quickly during class.
- ③ At the family science night, Noor made a multimodal slide. It had a large photo of a running faucet, a bar graph, and two short captions. The image caught attention, the graph showed the comparison, and the captions named the best action. Using pictures, numbers, and words helped families understand the results even while walking past the display.
