Nia's Library Choice

- ① On Tuesday, Nia visited the school library during class. She wanted a book she could enjoy reading by herself for several days. First, she looked at the covers in the animal section. Then she read the back of two books and sampled a page from each one. Nia chose *Sea Otters and Their Tools* because its photographs and short chapters interested her.
- ② Back at her desk, Nia set a twenty-minute timer and placed her bookmark beside the book. She read quietly, turning pages without waiting for a teacher to tell her what to do. When she met the word *sleek*, she used the nearby sentence and photograph to figure out that it described the otter's smooth-looking body. She wrote the word on a sticky note.
- ③ At the timer's beep, Nia was surprised that twenty minutes had passed. She made a small note about a sea otter carrying a rock to open a shell, then returned the book to her reading folder. Before leaving, she checked the library card in the back. The book was due in two weeks, so Nia planned to read one chapter each day until she finished it.
