YOUR JOB Underline each act and scene label, circle each character tag, and number the bracketed stage directions. These parts show who speaks and when or where the action happens.

The Garden Hose

- ① ACT I, SCENE 1 [The school garden at sunrise. Maya carries a watering can. Theo kneels beside a wilted bean plant.] MAYA: Theo, why are you here before school? THEO: I promised Ms. Chen I would water the plants, but this bean looks weak. MAYA: Let us check the soil first. [Maya touches the dirt and shakes her head.]
- ② ACT I, SCENE 2 [Ten minutes later. The garden hose lies across the path.] THEO: The soil is dry, but the hose is leaking. MAYA: We need water for the beans, not a puddle on the path. [Ms. Chen enters with a toolbox.] MS. CHEN: What problem have you found? THEO: The hose has a small hole. [Maya moves the hose away from the seedlings.]
- ③ ACT II, SCENE 1 [The next afternoon. A dry patch of soil is now dark and damp.] MAYA: The new hose works. Look, the bean plant is standing taller. THEO: We solved the leak, and the roots got water. MS. CHEN: Tomorrow, we can build a small sign that says, "Keep the path clear." [They smile and carry the toolbox inside.]

3	Give two details that the stage directions in Act I, Scene 2 tell actors or readers.	The hose lies across the path, and Ms. Chen enters with a toolbox.
4	How does the change from Act I to Act II help show what happened to the bean plant?	Act II takes place the next afternoon and shows that the plant is taller after the leak was fixed.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

ACT I, SCENE 1 [At a library table, Nia searches her backpack.] NIA: I cannot find my library book. OMAR: Let us check the classroom shelf. ACT I, SCENE 2 [At the shelf, Omar points to a book.] OMAR: Here it is. You left it during reading. NIA: Now I can return it.

Accept equivalent explanations that connect character tags to speakers, scene labels to sections of an act, and stage directions to actions, time, or place. For the open task, check for one act, two clearly labeled scenes, two character tags, and a bracketed stage direction in each scene.
