The Library Seed Shelf

- ① On a rainy Saturday, Maya visited the Maple Street Library for a comic book. Near the checkout desk, she noticed small envelopes standing in a wooden box. Each envelope held seeds for beans, zinnias, or basil. A sign said, "Take a packet, grow it, and save some seeds to share." Maya had never seen a library lend something that could become a garden.
- ② The seed shelf began after local gardeners asked for a simple way to share extra seeds. Library volunteers sorted donations and wrote planting tips on labels. Anyone could borrow a packet without a library card, so families who did not have money for garden supplies could try growing food or flowers. The shelf also gave neighbors a reason to talk about soil, weather, and successful plants.
- ③ Before leaving, Maya chose basil seeds and a label explaining that basil needs sun and regular watering. She pictured pizza topped with leaves from her own pot. At home, she told her grandfather about the seed shelf. He offered to help her plant the seeds, and he planned to donate marigold seeds from his yard. Maya realized that one small packet could help many people learn, grow, and share.
