### Choosing a Fair Route

- ① On Saturday, Maya helped plan a bike route for the town’s spring fair. Her first map showed a short path beside the river and a longer path through Maple Park. The river path was flat, but its wooden bridge was narrow. The park path had shady trees, wide sidewalks, and a small fountain where riders could stop for water.
- ② Maya and her neighbor compared the routes during a practice ride. The park path was safer than the river path because it had fewer street crossings. It was also quieter in the morning, although the river path was more direct from Maya’s house. At the fountain, Maya chose the coolest water bottle from her bag and wrote notes in her blue notebook.
- ③ Before the fair, the planning group chose the park route. It was the safest choice for young riders, and its wide sidewalks made passing easier. The river route remained a good option for experienced cyclists who wanted a shorter trip. Maya placed a bright sign at each turn. She hoped clear directions would make the busy fair feel more welcoming for every rider.
