Seeds at the Library

- ① On Saturday, Maya visited the city library's seed swap. Its front table held packets of basil, beans, and marigolds. "It's helpful to label each packet," said Mr. Chen, the garden leader. He explained that clear labels affect whether gardeners choose seeds they can grow. The effect of one missing label can be a row of plants nobody expected. Maya wrote the plant names carefully before she placed the packets in baskets for visitors to take home.
- ② Near the window, three students planned a pollinator garden. "Put the sunflowers there, beside the fence," Maya suggested. Their tall stems would give bees a clear landing place. "They're also bright enough for visitors to notice," said Luis. The group checked a map to see where water collected after rain. They chose a dry corner because soggy soil can harm sunflower roots. Then they added a sign that named the flowers and explained why pollinators visit them.
- ③ Before leaving, Maya took two tomato packets to the checkout desk. She wanted to share one with her neighbor, who was new to gardening. Mr. Chen reminded her to read the planting directions, too. The seeds needed warm soil and several hours of sunlight each day. Maya planned to start them indoors, then move the young plants outside after the weather became mild. She thanked the volunteers and promised to return to the library garden in June.
