The Repair Café

- ① On Saturday, students at Riverside Middle School hosted a repair café, an event that kept useful items out of the trash. Families brought lamps, backpacks, and small appliances that needed attention. Maya, who enjoys taking things apart, checked a toaster whose cord was loose. Her partner, Eli, found a loose screw, which he placed in a labeled tray. A volunteer explained that each repair could save materials and money for families in the neighborhood over time.
- ② At one table, Mr. Chen showed visitors a bike that had a slipping chain. He used a tool that loosened the rear wheel, then adjusted its position. The bike, which belonged to sixth grader Nia, rolled smoothly after the repair. Nia thanked the mechanic who had explained each step. She also met a neighbor whose old sewing machine was being tested nearby. By noon, the room held conversations that connected people who liked solving problems with their hands.
- ③ Before the café ended, organizers recorded the number of items that visitors had repaired. They also wrote down the skills that volunteers had shared, such as sewing, wiring, and tool safety. A display board listed the objects whose owners planned to use them again. One sign described a radio that had not played for years. Another featured the team who had repaired it. The notes, which will help organizers plan future events, showed that careful repairs can give ordinary objects a longer life.
