One Study, Three Ways to Share It

- ① Sixth graders studied how students traveled to school for a month. Their survey showed that 58 students walked, 41 rode in cars, 23 biked, and 18 took buses. Maya needed to share the numbers with the principal, who was deciding where to add bike racks. She made a one-page written report with a table and a bar graph. The graph let the principal compare travel methods quickly, while the short paragraphs explained how the survey was collected and why the results mattered.
- ② Later, Maya’s group spoke at a student council meeting. Instead of reading every number aloud, they gave a two-minute oral summary. Maya named the biggest finding, that walking was the most common choice, and asked council members to support safer crosswalks. Her partner answered questions about the survey. The oral delivery fit this audience because council members could respond right away, and the group could adjust its explanation when a listener wanted more details. Their spoken message focused on the decision the council needed to make.
- ③ For families at an evening open house, the group chose a multimodal display. A large map showed where students started their trips, colored strings traced common routes, and a screen displayed the bar graph. Students also gave brief explanations beside the display. Families could see the data, hear the group’s ideas, and point to routes that concerned them. Using several modes helped visitors who had different questions and gave them a clear picture of both the results and the safety problem. The group used the same research, but changed its delivery for each purpose and audience.

4	How did the group change its delivery for families, and what need did that change meet?	They used a multimodal display instead of only a written report or oral summary. It let families see data, hear explanations, ask different questions, and understand the safety problem.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

I will use a multimodal display for families at curriculum night. Our class survey found that 36 students prefer paperback books and 19 prefer e-books. I will show a bar graph and display sample covers, then explain the results aloud. Families can compare the choices quickly and ask questions about books they might donate.
