The Green Team Shares Its Findings

- ① For two weeks, the Green Team counted how much trash appeared near the cafeteria after lunch. Students sorted the litter into paper, plastic, and food waste, then recorded totals on a chart. Plastic wrappers were the most common item on nine of the ten school days. Food waste was highest on pizza day, when many students threw away unopened fruit cups. The team wanted to share these results with students, families, and the principal so the school could choose ways to reduce waste.
- ② First, the team planned a short written report for the principal. The report would include a table with the three litter categories and a paragraph explaining the pattern on pizza day. A written report fit this audience because the principal needed exact numbers to compare possible solutions and keep for later meetings. Next, the team chose a two-minute oral announcement for homeroom. Speaking directly could reach many students quickly and ask them to place wrappers in the correct bins.
- ③ Finally, the Green Team designed a slide for the cafeteria screen. It showed a bar graph of the ten-day totals, a photo of the sorting bins, and the message, "Empty your tray, then sort your waste." The group used this multimodal display because students could see the bins and the results while standing in line. Each delivery mode presented the same finding, but it gave each audience the details and format they needed. The team planned to check litter totals again after one month to see whether the messages helped.
