Sharing Courtyard Survey Results

- ① After surveying students about the lunch courtyard, Maya's inquiry team needed to share its results with the principal. Their findings showed that 68 of 90 respondents wanted more shade near the tables. For the principal, the team chose a written report. The report included a brief methods section, exact response totals in sentences, and a recommendation to add two shade sails. The principal could read the details, compare the numbers, and keep the report while planning next year's budget.
- ② At the weekly student council meeting, the team used an oral announcement instead. One speaker stated the main result and explained how the survey was conducted. A second speaker described the proposed shade sails and invited council members to ask questions. They did not display slides, posters, charts, or handouts. This delivery let the group hear a quick summary and respond immediately, but listeners could not study every response total during the announcement or review it later.
- ③ For families who could not attend the meeting, the team created a multimodal infographic for the school website. It paired short written captions with a bar graph showing how many students chose each survey response. A labeled map showed where shade was most needed, and a photo of the courtyard gave viewers context. The infographic made the results easy to scan online, but the team also linked the full written report for readers who wanted the methods and totals.

1	Which delivery mode did the team use at the student council meeting? Give two details from the passage that prove your answer.	Oral delivery. Two speakers gave the announcement, and the team did not use slides, posters, charts, or handouts.
2	Why was a written report an appropriate choice for the principal? Use two details from the passage.	The principal needed details and numbers for budget planning. The report included methods, exact totals, and a recommendation, and it could be kept for later use.
3	What features make the school website infographic multimodal?	It combines written captions with a bar graph, a labeled map, and a photo.
4	Choose the best delivery mode for each need: responding immediately to the results and checking the survey methods later. Explain your choices.	An oral announcement is best for responding immediately because listeners can ask questions. A written report is best for checking methods later because readers can study and keep the details.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

I would give a written report to the librarian. In a survey of 80 students, 52 said they would use a quiet reading area. The report would include the survey question, response totals, and a short recommendation. A written report fits the librarian because she can examine the evidence and use it while making library plans.

Accept responses that correctly identify written, oral, and multimodal delivery and support choices with passage evidence. For the open task, accept any logical mode choice when the student names an audience, presents a result, includes at least two fitting features, and explains the match.
