HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read every prompt and choice aloud. In Part 1, help children connect a comprehension problem to a helpful fix. In Part 2, pause for children to signal when they need help, then reread the text before they circle an answer.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • PICK A FIX

SAY “Sometimes a story does not make sense right away. Listen to each problem and circle the word that tells what you could do next.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	I read a sentence, but you did not hear it. The choices are Look, Reread, and Think. Which choice means hear the sentence one more time? Circle it.	Reread
b	I will show you a page in a picture book. A word is hard. The choices are Look, Ask, and Reread. Which choice means check the picture for a clue? Circle it.	Look
c	You hear a word you do not know. The choices are Think, Look, and Ask. Which choice means ask an adult a question? Circle it.	Ask
d	Before we listen to a story about a kite, you can remember kites you have seen or used. The choices are Look, Think, and Ask. Which choice means use what you already know? Circle it.	Think

PART 2 • LISTEN AGAIN

SAY “I will read each short part once. If you are not sure, raise your hand so I can read it again, then listen to the question and circle your answer.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Listen: Nia puts a map in her bag. Then Nia walks to the library. What does Nia put in her bag? The choices are map, book, and cup. Circle your answer.	map
b	Listen: The sidewalk is wet. Leo opens his umbrella. What fell from the sky? The choices are snow, rain, and leaves. Circle your answer.	rain

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Part 1 answers are Reread, Look, Ask, and Think. Part 2 answers are map and rain; accept answers after adult support such as rereading, discussing known information, or checking a picture-book page.
