**HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE**

Before the sheet, model a paper strip folded into two same-size parts and say that the parts are equal. Read every choice aloud, then read each description slowly. Students show whether they can name equal parts as halves or fourths and tell when shares are not equal.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

**PART 1 • CIRCLE WORDS**

**SAY** “Listen to each share story. I will read the words in the row. Which word matches the share story? Circle that word.”

| b   | A rectangle is split into four same-size parts. Which word names the parts: equal, halves, or fourths? Circle the word.                   | <b>fourths</b>  |
| c   | A square has two parts, but one part is bigger. Which word tells that the parts are not fair: equal, unequal, or halves? Circle the word. | <b>unequal</b>  |

**PART 2 • MATCH SHARES**

**SAY** “Look at the numbers and word on the left: 2, 4, and fair. Look at the words on the right: equal, halves, and fourths. For each one on the left, which word on the right matches it? Draw a line to show your matches.”

- **2** matches **halves**
- **4** matches **fourths**
- **fair** matches **equal**

**WHAT TO ACCEPT**

Circle halves in row 1, fourths in row 2, and unequal in row 3. Match 2 to halves, 4 to fourths, and fair to equal.
