MONEY CHOICES

Money choices can be sorted by what happens to the money. Income is money you receive. Spending is using money to buy something, saving is keeping it for later, credit is borrowing money to pay back, and charitable giving is giving money to help people or a cause.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Noah earns \$19. He saves \$5 and gives \$4 to an animal shelter. How much money is left to spend?

1. Start with \$19.
2. Subtract the \$5 he saves: $\$19 - \$5 = \$14$.
3. Subtract the \$4 he gives: $\$14 - \$4 = \$10$.

Answer: \$10 is left to spend.

CHALLENGE One step up

CHALLENGE

Nia receives \$34 for doing jobs at home. She spends \$9 on art supplies and gives \$7 to a charity. She splits the money left into two equal parts. She saves one part and keeps one part for later spending. How much does she save, and how much can she spend later? Explain with an equation.

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **She saves \$13. Buying the book is spending, and giving to the food drive is charitable giving.** Subtract the book cost and donation from \$27: $\$27 - \$8 - \$6 = \13 . The book is spending, and the food drive donation is charitable giving.
2. **Borrowing is credit. Yes, he has exactly \$26.** Add the saved money and borrowed money: $\$17 + \$9 = \$26$. Borrowing money to pay back is credit.

CHALLENGE

She saves \$9 and can spend \$9 later. $\$34 - \$9 - \$7 = \18 , and $\$18 / 2 = \9 .

Accept "donation" for charitable giving and "borrowing" for credit. For the challenge, accept any correct equation sequence that shows \$18 left and two equal parts of \$9.
