PLACE VALUE LINKS

The first digit to the right of the decimal point names tenths.
The second digit to the right names hundredths. Write a fraction with 10 for tenths or 100 for hundredths.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Write 0.63 as a fraction that names hundredths.

1. The 6 is in the tenths place and the 3 is in the hundredths place.
2. 63 is 63 hundredths.
3. Write 63 over 100.

Answer: 63/100

1	Write 0.4 as a fraction that names tenths.	4/10

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **42/100** 0.42 means 42 hundredths, so write 42/100.
2. **0.7** Seven tenths is written as 0.7.

CHALLENGE

Yes. $0.5 = 5/10$, and $0.50 = 50/100$. Both fractions name the same amount.

Require fractions with denominators of 10 or 100 when the prompt asks for tenths or hundredths. Accept equivalent decimal forms with trailing zeros, such as 0.8 for 0.80.
