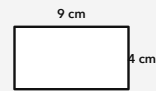

AREA OR PERIMETER?

To find the area of a rectangle, multiply its length by its width.
To find the perimeter, add the lengths of all four sides, and use square units only for area.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Look at the rectangle. Find its area and perimeter.

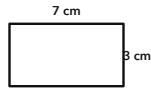


1. The length is 9 cm and the width is 4 cm.
2. Area = $9 \times 4 = 36$ square cm.
3. Perimeter = $9 + 4 + 9 + 4 = 26$ cm.

Answer: Area: 36 square cm; Perimeter: 26 cm

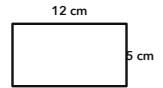

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **Border: 52 inches; Area: 160 square inches** Find the border by adding all four sides: $16 + 10 + 16 + 10 = 52$. Multiply 16×10 to find the area.
2. **168 square cm** Multiply the length by the width: $21 \times 8 = 168$.

CHALLENGE

Length: 10 inches; Area: 70 square inches. The two widths total 14 inches, so the two lengths total 20 inches. Each length is 10 inches, and $10 \times 7 = 70$.

Accept square units written as square cm, cm^2 , square inches, or in^2 . For the challenge, accept any clear explanation that finds the two missing equal sides and then multiplies length by width.
