5.6.A "recognize a cube with side length of one unit as a unit cube having one cubic unit of volume and the volume of a three-dimensional figure as the number of unit cubes (n cubic units) needed to fill it with no gaps or overlaps if possible..."

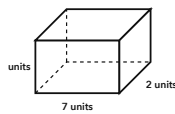

EXACT UNIT-CUBE FILL

This solid can be filled with whole unit cubes with no gaps or overlaps. Its volume can be counted in cubic units.

A rectangular prism that is 7 units long, 2 units wide, and 3 units high has an exact unit-cube fill.



NOT AN EXACT UNIT-CUBE FILL

This solid cannot be filled with whole unit cubes with no gaps or overlaps. Curved or slanted surfaces prevent an exact fill.

A cone has a curved surface, so whole unit cubes cannot fill it exactly.

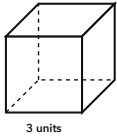

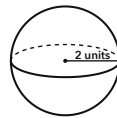

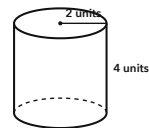

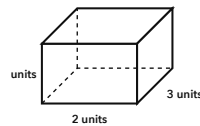

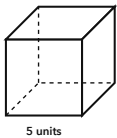

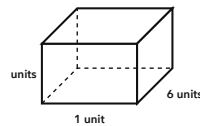

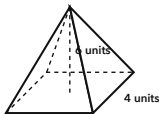

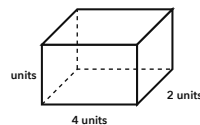

CHALLENGE

A rectangular prism is 5 units long, 2 units wide, and 4 units high. Decide its category and find how many unit cubes fill it.

PART 1 • SORT

#	ITEM	CATEGORY	WHY
1	Figure 1 (cube)	EXACT	A cube with a whole-number side length can be filled by 1-unit cubes with no gaps or overlaps.
2	Figure 2 (sphere)	NOT EXACT	A sphere has a curved surface, so unit cubes leave gaps around the curve.
3	Figure 3 (cylinder)	NOT EXACT	A cylinder has curved sides, so unit cubes cannot fill it with no gaps or overlaps.
4	Figure 4 (prism)	EXACT	This rectangular prism has whole-number unit dimensions and can be filled by unit cubes.
5	Figure 5 (cube)	EXACT	A cube with side length 5 units can be filled exactly by unit cubes.
6	Figure 6 (prism)	EXACT	This rectangular prism has whole-number unit dimensions and can be filled exactly by unit cubes.
7	Figure 7 (pyramid)	NOT EXACT	A pyramid has slanted faces, so whole unit cubes cannot make an exact fill.
8	Figure 8 (prism)	EXACT	This rectangular prism has whole-number unit dimensions and can be filled by unit cubes.

PART 2 • PROVE IT

Accept any explanation that names the deciding feature from the rule box for the chosen item.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **EXACT:** A rectangular prism that is 3 units long, 3 units wide, and 2 units high can be filled with 18 unit cubes.
- **NOT EXACT:** A cone with a radius of 3 units and a height of 4 units cannot be filled exactly with whole unit cubes because it has a curved surface.

Challenge: EXACT. $5 \times 2 \times 4 = 40$, so 40 unit cubes fill the prism.

Items 1, 4, 5, 6, and 8 are EXACT. Items 2, 3, and 7 are NOT EXACT because their curved or slanted surfaces prevent a gap-free, overlap-free fill with whole unit cubes.
