HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Tell students that every job uses skills, which are things a worker knows how to do. Give a different example, such as, "A musician needs to practice." Read every printed word aloud so students can choose and match the skills.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE A SKILL

SAY "Listen as I tell you about each worker and read the words in the row. Circle the skill that worker needs."

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	A cashier adds prices and gives change. The words say count, mix, clean. Which skill does a cashier need? Circle it.	count
b	A baker puts ingredients together to make food. The words say drive, mix, dig. Which skill does a baker need? Circle it.	mix
c	A cleaner washes rooms and picks up trash. The words say teach, clean, build. Which skill does a cleaner need? Circle it.	clean

PART 2 • MATCH JOBS

SAY "On the left are job names. On the right are skills. I will read all the words. Draw a line from each job to the skill that worker needs."

- **Builder** matches **build**
- **Gardener** matches **dig**
- **Teacher** matches **teach**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle count for cashier, mix for baker, and clean for cleaner. Match Builder to build, Gardener to dig, and Teacher to teach.
