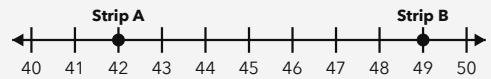

MEASURE AND COMPARE

Choose a tool that matches what you need to measure. Metric rulers measure length, scales measure mass, graduated cylinders measure liquid volume, thermometers measure temperature, and timers measure time. To find how much a measurement changed, subtract the smaller measurement from the larger one and write the correct unit.

WORKED EXAMPLE

The metric ruler below shows the lengths of two strings. How much longer is Strip B than Strip A?



1. Read Strip A as 42 cm.
2. Read Strip B as 49 cm.
3. Subtract: $49\text{ cm} - 42\text{ cm} = 7\text{ cm}$.

Answer: 7 cm

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **Wednesday, 4°C warmer than Monday** The highest temperature is 25°C on Wednesday. Subtract 21°C from 25°C to find a difference of 4°C.
2. **23 photos** Add the butterfly photos and bee photos: $14 + 9 = 23$.

CHALLENGE

The water has a mass of 68 g because $154\text{ g} - 86\text{ g} = 68\text{ g}$. The empty beaker's mass must be subtracted.

Accept correct units written as g, mL, cm, and °C. For the challenge, accept any explanation that subtracts the empty beaker mass from the combined mass.
