HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each row aloud and have students circle one large word. Students show that they can tell goods from services, recognize buying and trading, and identify where buyers and sellers meet.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • GOODS OR HELP

SAY "Listen as I read the words in each row. Think about the place I name, then circle the word that answers my question."

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	At home, which word names a good your family might use? Blanket, dentist, helper. Circle your answer.	blanket
b	At school, which word names a person who does a service? Book, teacher, pencil. Circle your answer.	teacher
c	In the community, which word names a person who gives a service? Bread, ball, nurse. Circle your answer.	nurse

PART 2 • EXCHANGE PLACES

SAY "Listen to each question and the words in its row. Circle the word that best answers the question."

a	When a person buys a good, which word tells what the person might give? Money, book, sleep. Circle your answer.	money
b	Which word names a way people can exchange goods without using money? Money, trade, market. Circle your answer.	trade
c	Which place brings buyers and sellers together? Home, school, market. Circle your answer.	market
