**HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE**

Read every story and every printed choice aloud. Students identify when people want more than they can have, then identify the one good or service a family chooses when it cannot buy everything.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

**PART 1 • MORE WANTED**

**SAY** “Listen to each story. Hear the three words in the row, then circle the word that answers the question.”

**SAY** “Each family can get only one thing. Listen to what the family chooses, hear the words in the row, and circle the good or service it gets.”

| b   | The Chen family can pay for one service. They choose a haircut, not a movie. Which service do they choose? Circle MOVIE, BOTH, or HAIRCUT. | <b>HAIRCUT</b>  |
| c   | The Davis family can buy only one. They choose a game, not a book. Which good do they buy? Circle GAME, BOOK, or BOTH.                     | <b>GAME</b>     |
