HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each part aloud and give students time to say their ideas before they mark the page. Students show that workers use special tools, do jobs well by working in positive ways, and help make goods or provide services.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • JOB TOOLS

SAY “Look at the job words on the left and the tool words on the right. What does each worker help make or do? Draw a line from each job to the tool that worker uses.”

- **baker** matches **spoon**
- **farmer** matches **rake**
- **doctor** matches **stethoscope**

PART 2 • WORK WELL

SAY “For each row, listen to the job. First, tell how that worker helps people or makes something. Then listen to the words and circle the word that tells how the worker should do the job.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	A doctor has a job. What service does a doctor give? Read the words: careful, messy, sleepy. Which word tells how a doctor should work? Circle it.	careful
b	A farmer has a job. What does a farmer help make or grow? Read the words: lazy, hard, rude. Which word tells how a farmer should work? Circle it.	hard
c	A baker has a job. What does a baker make? Read the words: noisy, messy, clean. Which word tells how a baker should work? Circle it.	clean

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Match baker to spoon, farmer to rake, and doctor to stethoscope. Circle careful, hard, and clean. Accept oral descriptions such as a doctor helps sick people, a farmer grows food, and a baker makes bread.
