HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Tell students that the first word in a sentence starts with a capital letter. Explain that names and the word I also use capital letters. Read the choices aloud, then have students make each mark.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Listen as I read each sentence and the words in its row. Can you circle the word that is written the right way?”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Listen: “We run.” I will read the words: We, we, wE. Which word is written the right way at the start of the sentence?	We
b	Listen: “Noah has a hat.” I will read the words: noah, nOah, Noah. Which word is written the right way for Noah’s name?	Noah
c	Listen: “I can hop.” I will read the choices: i, l, I. Which choice is the word I written the right way?	I
d	Listen: “Friday is fun.” I will read the words: friday, Friday, fridAy. Which word is written the right way at the start of the sentence?	Friday

PART 2 • TRACE CAPITALS

SAY “Look at the gray word in each box. Can you trace each gray word carefully?”
