MATCHING FORMS

In a series, matching ideas use matching grammatical forms. For example, all three parts might be past-tense verbs or infinitive phrases.

MIXED FORMS

A series has mixed forms when matching ideas are not built alike. One part may be a verb while another part is a different form.

After the curtain rose, the actors began to speak, singing softly, and to move across the stage.
