EQUAL IDEAS

A coordinating conjunction joins two independent clauses that have equal importance. Words such as and, but, so, and yet can show this relationship.

The gardener watered the seedlings, and the soil darkened.

DEPENDENT IDEAS

A subordinating word makes one clause depend on the other clause. Words such as because, although, since, and when can show time, cause, or contrast.

Because the river rose, the ferry stopped running.
