4	Each winter, the lake freezes and the trail becomes quiet.	CONSISTENT	Both verbs, freezes and becomes, are present tense.
5	Yesterday, the team warms up before it played.	SHIFTING	Warms is present tense, while played is past tense.
6	In the novel, the hero crossed the bridge and discovers a map.	SHIFTING	Crossed is past tense, while discovers is present tense.
7	After lunch, we study in the library and finish our notes.	CONSISTENT	Both verbs, study and finish, are present tense.
8	When the alarm rang, Diego jumps out of bed.	SHIFTING	Rang is past tense, while jumps is present tense.
