PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **STATED:** "The speaker admits, 'I regret hiding the truth.'"
- **IMPLIED:** After the team loses, Priya says, "I just love watching our lead disappear."

Challenge: The rain canceled the picnic again. "Wonderful," Sam said, folding the untouched blanket. The implied emotion is disappointment, shown by "Wonderful" and the untouched blanket.

For Part 2, students should name the category and cite a word, detail, or context clue. Accept reasonable inferences for imagery items when students explain how the details support the inference.
