A Later First Bell

- ① Riverton High should move its first bell from 7:25 to 8:30 a.m. Many teenagers do not get enough sleep because their natural sleep schedules shift later during adolescence. The American Academy of Pediatrics has recommended that middle and high schools start at 8:30 a.m. or later to help students get sufficient sleep. In districts that have delayed start times, students have reported more sleep and less daytime tiredness. A later bell would not solve every cause of exhaustion, but it would remove one school-created barrier to rest.
- ② Critics may worry that a later start would interfere with sports, jobs, and bus schedules. Those concerns deserve planning, not dismissal. The district could coordinate bus routes with elementary schools, schedule some practices before school, and survey students who work after class. Schools already adjust calendars and transportation for weather, testing, and events. A change in the first bell would require similar careful coordination. Because the benefits reach every student each morning, the district should compare those benefits with the manageable costs of revising routines.
- ③ Evidence points to a practical choice after considering both benefits and challenges. Moving the first bell later would give students a better chance to sleep enough, while the district can plan for transportation, activities, and after-school jobs. Riverton High should adopt an 8:30 start time for a one-year trial, then review attendance, grades, student sleep reports, and effects on schedules. This measured step supports student health, responds to reasonable concerns, and allows leaders to adjust the plan using early results from the trial rather than assumptions.

It responds to the evidence that later starts can help students sleep and to the scheduling concerns. A one-year trial allows the school to plan for logistics and review results before making a permanent decision.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Riverton High should create a quiet lunch space in the library. Some students need a calmer place to eat, read, or finish work when the cafeteria is crowded and noisy. The library already has tables and supervision, so the school could test the space without building a new room. Therefore, the principal should open the quiet lunch space for one month and collect student feedback before making it permanent.
