COMPLEX SENTENCE

A complex sentence has one independent clause and at least one dependent clause. A dependent clause cannot stand alone.

After the rain stopped, the streets gleamed.

COMPOUND SENTENCE

A compound sentence joins two independent clauses, often with a comma and a coordinating conjunction or with a semicolon. Each clause can stand alone.

Dawn arrived, so the owls returned home.
