Editing with MLA Style

- ① MLA style helps readers trace a writer's evidence. In a research paper, a brief parenthetical citation usually follows a borrowed idea or quotation. The citation directs readers to an entry on the Works Cited page. When a source has a named author and page numbers, MLA commonly uses the author's last name and the page number, with no comma: (Garcia 42). The period comes after the closing parenthesis. A writer should compare every in-text citation with the Works Cited list, because each cited source needs a full entry there.
- ② A signal phrase can name an author before borrowed material. If the source has page numbers, place only the page number in parentheses after the material. If the named source has no page numbers, MLA ordinarily needs no parenthetical citation. Do not add a shortened title simply because the author appears in the sentence. A shortened title may help distinguish among multiple works by the same author, but only when readers need that distinction. In either case, the source must appear on the Works Cited page. Accurate citation choices show exactly which source supports the claim.
- ③ MLA editing also includes checking the Works Cited page. Start each entry at the left margin, then indent later lines one-half inch. Alphabetize entries by the first element, usually the author's last name. For an online article, record the author, article title in quotation marks, website title in italics, publication date when available, URL, and access date if your teacher requires it. Keep punctuation and capitalization consistent with MLA models. Before submitting, verify that quotations match the original wording and that every Works Cited entry is cited in the paper itself.
