Sea Turtle Report

- ① Sea turtles live in warm oceans. A hatchling is a baby sea turtle. After it leaves its nest, a hatchling crawls toward the water. Its flippers help it move through sand and swim.
- ② To share this news aloud, use a clear voice. Pause after the word hatchling so listeners can think. Say flippers a little louder because they are important body parts. Do not rush the long word camouflage.
- ③ Sea turtles use camouflage to blend in with their surroundings. A turtle with a brown shell may be harder for a hungry fish to see near rocks. Read this sentence slowly and smoothly, like waves moving toward shore.
