A Pool by the Shore

- ① At low tide, ocean water slips back from the shore. Small pools stay between the rocks. These tide pools are like tiny homes. Crabs, sea stars, and snails may hide there until the water rises again.
- ② Pia crouches beside a pool and looks carefully. A crab skitters under a rock. Skitters means it moves quickly with short steps. Pia reads that line again, then makes her voice quick when she reads the word skitters.
- ③ Then Pia sees a sea star clinging to the rock. She does not rush past the long word. She looks at sea and star, reads it again, and understands that a sea star is an animal, not a shining star.
