- ① Mina carried a folded map as she and her grandfather walked through Pine Park. They planned to find the old stone bridge before lunch. A gust of wind tugged the map from Mina's hand and sent it spinning behind some bushes.
- ② Mina looked under leaves, but the map was gone. Her grandfather pointed to a squirrel on a low branch. Bits of paper fluttered near its nest. Mina saw a corner of the map caught in the twigs.
- ③ Grandfather found a long fallen branch. Mina gently lifted the branch toward the nest, and the map slipped free. She thanked the squirrel for helping her notice it. Then they followed the map and reached the bridge together.

1	What problem changes Mina and her grandfather's plan?	The wind blows Mina's map away, and it gets caught near a squirrel's nest.
2	What clue helps Mina find the map?	She sees bits of paper fluttering near the squirrel's nest and notices a corner of the map in the twigs.
3	How does the fallen branch solve the problem?	Mina uses it to gently reach the nest, and the map slips free.
