Learning About Beavers

- ① A wildlife guide says beavers have wide, flat tails. The guide explains that a beaver can slap its tail on water to warn other beavers about danger. The guide also shows a beaver's webbed back feet.
- ② A park website has a photo of a beaver lodge. It says beavers pile sticks and mud to make the lodge. The entrance is under water, which helps keep some animals out.
- ③ Ms. Lee, a park ranger, was asked where beavers live. She said beavers need water and often live near ponds, streams, or rivers. She also said their dams can slow water and make ponds.
